#### 附件三 会议嘉宾简介

Patrick Corrigan is Distinguished Professor of Psychology at the Illinois Prior to that, he was Professor of Psychiatry at the Institute of Technology. University of Chicago where he directed its Center on Psychiatric Rehabilitation. research examines psychiatric disability and social disadvantage. Currently, he is principal investigator of the Chicago Health Disparities Center. Funded by the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities and the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute, this work examines how ethnic and income disparities further lessen the opportunities of those with serious mental illness. work is employing peers in the direct delivery of services. He has written more than 400 peer-reviewed articles, is editor emeritus of the American Journal of Psychiatric Rehabilitation, and editor of Stigma and Health published by the American Psychological Association. Corrigan has authored or edited seventeen books, most recently, The Stigma Effect published by Columbia University Press. In 2019, Corrigan received the presidential medal from the Royal College of Psychiatrists for his work.

Chow S. Lam is Laureate Professor Emeritus of Rehabilitation and Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Psychology from the Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago. He held visiting and honorary professorships at the University of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, the Sun Yat-Sen University's School of Medicine in Guangzhou and the West China Medical University in Sichuan. A prolific writer with more than 120 articles and book chapters, Dr. Lam is the recipient of the 2005 James Garret Distinguished Research Career Award, Fellow of the American Psychological Association (APA) and Distinguished Research Fellow of the National Institute on Disabilities and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR) and the first Chinese-American elected as President of the American Rehabilitation Counseling Association in 2000-2001.

Zhiying Ma is an Assistant Professor at the University of Chicago School of Social Service Administration. Trained as a cultural and medical anthropologist, she has conducted extensive fieldwork on family and community care for people with serious mental illnesses in China. She has published articles in journals such as Culture, Medicine, and Psychiatry as well as chapters in edited volumes. Besides her own work, she has also been involved in collaborative research and intervention projects to develop anti-stigma training for mental health professionals and to promote the inclusion of persons with serious mental illnesses in community life.

Lindsay Sheehan, Ph. D. is a Senior Research Associate at the Illinois Institute of Technology. Trained as a rehabilitation counselor, Lindsay worked at a community mental health center for over a decade, where she promoted employment and independent living goals for individuals with serious mental illness. She has conducted and published research on peer services, stigma, and community-based participatory research. Two of her federally-funded projects have focused on inclusion of people with serious mental illness in research.

Sonya Ballentine graduated from Georgia State University with a Bachelor of Science in Finance and worked for several years in the business sector before being hospitalized and diagnosed with bipolar disorder in 2007. As her mental health has stabilized, she is proud to once again be a productive member of society. Ms. Ballentine began working with the Illinois Institute of Technology in 2012 as a patient-representative on a community-based participatory research team. The team designed and evaluated a peer services program for homeless African Americans with serious mental illness. Currently, Ms. Ballentine manages another federally funded project on peer services.
